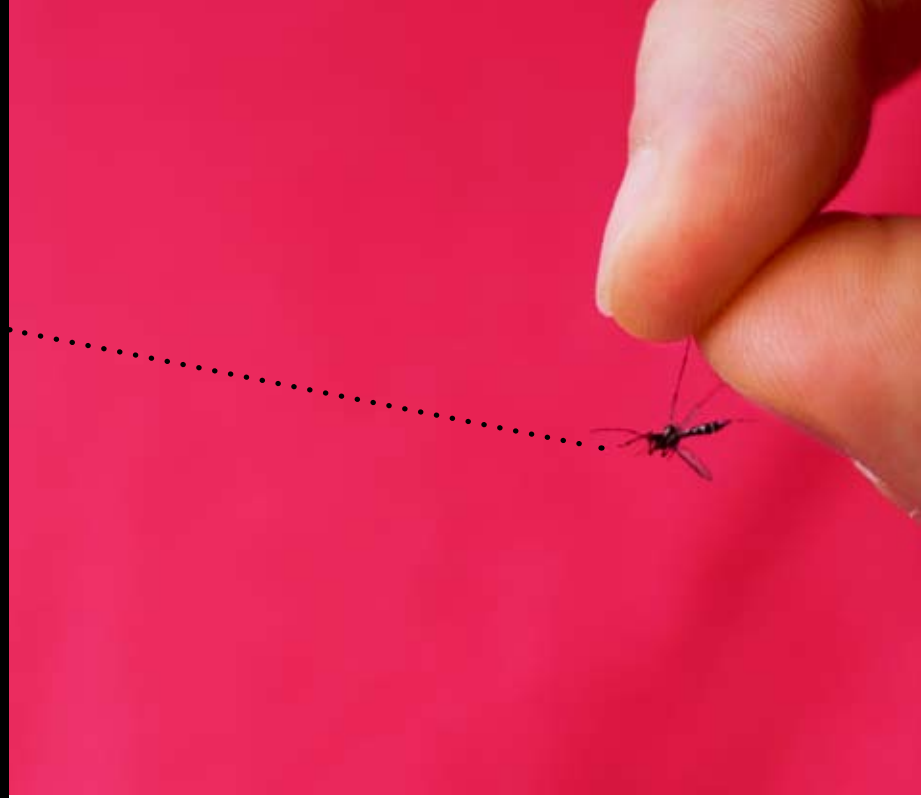

WHY DO MOSQUITOES SUCK?

Some of the world's biggest problems, are found in surprisingly small packages. Malaria is one of them. Over one million African children - one every thirty seconds - die of the disease every year, simply due to exposure to something many consider to be tiny, harmless nuisances: mosquitoes. Malaria, long eradicated from most of the world's developed countries, continues to wreak havoc on economies, families, and individuals in the Global South.



1 BITE

is all it takes to become infected.

60 SECONDS

and another child dies.

3.3 BILLION

people are at risk.

250 MILLION

malaria cases per year.

1 MILLION

lives lost to malaria each year.

5 YEARS

and under are the children at greatest risk.



1 NET

Just as it is easily contracted (all it takes is one little mosquito bite), the disease is also simple to prevent. A mosquito bed net can protect up to five children for five years.
